

Message From the Executive Principal - Mr Jeff Jones Alignment at Woodcrest

As the business end of the year approaches the importance of our student achievement is highlighted. Across our campus the alignment of our programs, processes and outcomes are being examined as we get into planning for 2023. This never-ending cycle of developing, prioritising, planning, acting and then monitoring and reviewing is how we make Woodcrest a great place for students to learn in.

We actively engage with our local early childhood centres to ensure that our future students' transitions into our college are as smooth as possible so they get the best possible start to their formal education. This work has been happening for the past 6 months and is certainly a focus for our primary sub school over the next few months. In the same way we also work with our feeder primary schools to create equally smooth transitions from Year 6 into Year 7. It's important for us to be able to meet the needs of our incoming student body that we have strong relationships with our local primary schools so we can prepare and cater for the next wave of high school students as they continue on their education journey.

Just as important as transitioning into the college is the work we do with our senior students as they transition out from learning at Woodcrest to further education, training, or employment. Our support of our most experienced students is designed to help them have the best opportunity to live a life of choice not a life of chance and their success are celebrated throughout the college on a regular basis. A large part of professional conversations focuses on our work being the right work to support our students' aspirations. Recent studies of Australian secondary students by social demographers McCrindle have found that just 14% of students are looking for traditional employment. The majority of students are now looking at a hybrid version of work whereby they have their own entrepreneurial work to sit alongside some employment.

This of course has implications for education in the manner of what we deliver that supports the new approach to post school activity.

Further findings from the McCrindle research found that the top three platforms that students use on a daily basis to teach themselves new skills were teachers, websites and TikTok. The intentional focus to create a Seamless P-12 curriculum has seen has Woodcrest staff working together to align practices and approaches that thoughtfully plan and cater for the crayon to career scope of our college as we strive to co-create a pathway for every student from Prep-Year 12.

We've recently revamped The Nest (our student operated café) and the dining room for our Hospitality students to work and learn in. We've also created an Esports room which means both our primary and secondary Esports club members can collaborate together to develop skills in this new team sport. In the future we will align this to our curriculum offerings to enrich the experiences of the students as they move through the college. Hopefully you had the chance to see this at the 25th Anniversary open day.

With 25 years of rich history and dedication from staff and the community, Woodcrest continues to be recognised as a school that puts students first. The college staff actively support each other's professional growth in order to provide the best possible education for each child no matter what their circumstances are.
