Year 11 & 12 Exam Block

On Thursday 8th September our Year 12 students commenced their exam block and Year 11s began on Monday 12th September. This exam block is extremely important for Year 12s, as it prepares students for what to expect in the external examinations in Term 4, and will provide them with feedback about how they can improve prior to their commencement.

Additionally, this exam block for Year 11 see students completing the final exams for Unit 2. Satisfactory completion of Unit 1 and 2 in Year 11 is important for QCE success. ent is required to be in attendance, please ensure they attend.

Homework Centre

As we approach the end of term, our students are very busy finalising assignments and assessment tasks and preparing for upcoming exams. The Homework Centre staff are here to help, with tutorials and homework assistance from teachers and teacher aides on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 3pm – 4pm in the secondary library. Students who attend are provided with afternoon tea.

Bring Your Own Device

Just a reminder that it is extremely important students are bringing their laptops each and every day. Across the school we are using laptops in most lessons to deliver aspects of the curriculum and students regularly use OneNote as their notebook platform. Additionally, teachers use OneNote to provide course materials and other platforms including electronic textbooks.

If students don't bring their devices, it is like turning up without a pencil case, notebook or textbook. Being ready for learning is the first aspect of our school-wide learning framework. I encourage all students to ensure they are ready for learning every day. Any student needing assistance with onboarding their device are asked to go to the IT window before school or during first break. Additionally, the College has a small number of equity devices that we can provide to students who may be experiencing difficulties. If you believe you may be eligible for an equity device, please complete an application via the College website and contact your year level Deputy Principal for assistance.

Dress Code

Students are reminded to ensure that they present to school in full and correct uniform. As we approach the end of winter, students are reminded that if they wish to wear a jumper, they must only wear a College uniform approved jumper. Students who require a jumper, but are unable to acquire one at this time are asked to attend Ithrive prior to school for assistance. Students are also asked to ensure they are meeting the dress code standard in regards to shoes, jewellery and hair presentation. Please refer to the student diary or school website for details of the dress code.

Attendance

Well done to all of the students who have achieved 100% attendance this term to date. As we move into Spring we are hopeful that there will be less illness around and therefore more students will be healthy and at school every day.

We have been very concerned with student attendance this year and have really focused on this in Term 3. We finally have something to celebrate with Week 9 attendance data being the best data yet this term. Two of our year levels met this year's target of 92% during Week 9 and this is the first time any year levels have achieved this. Additionally, 15 classes also achieved 90% or greater in Week 9. A step in the right direction and with warmer weather coming in Term 4 and the end of the flu season, we are hoping for even better data to come. Please support your child/ren's education by ensuring their attendance at school every day possible.

In all, 210 Zooper Doopers were awarded to individual weekly winners and 9 different classes shared the weekly class prize during the term. The class competition for the best attenders in Term 3 will be announced in Week 1 Term 4 as we need the Week 10 data to finalise the result. I will also be rewarding individual students who have had 100% attendance in Term 3.

Reporting

At the end of Term 1, primary trialled mid-semester interim student reports to parents. Feed back from that trial was varied in that we only reported on English and Maths and gave no behaviour or effort results. It was decided that we would not continue these interim reports in primary.

We will however still be conducting Parent/Teacher interviews in Week 2 on Thursday 13 October from 3:00pm – 6:30pm in the Primary Hall. Parents can book interviews through SOBS (School Online Booking Service) as occurred at the end of Term 1. An email will be sent with the link to book through SOBS in Week 1 after the break. A reminder that secondary interviews will be also on that evening in the Secondary Hall, but these finish as 6:00pm.

BYOD EOI for 2023

It is that exciting time of year again, where we offer the opportunity to join our BYOD program at Woodcrest. This year we are thrilled to be offering the current Prep and Year 1 students the opportunity to join our program through the use of iPads.

The devices are used in the classroom to enhance students' learning experiences in accordance with the Department of Education's 21st Century learning guide. The purpose of the class is to create and maintain a highly engaging learning environment. A blend of traditional and digital learning approaches will be integrated to maximise the learning potential of every child. BYOD classes equip young people with the capacity to think, solve problems and respond to and thrive within a changing society. The use of technology as a tool, extends learning opportunities for all students combined with normal books, pen and paper to form the basis of the daily class routine.

Mikayla Harris fourth in 400m dash.


Salome Zapata-Gaspar 5th in 800 m and 1500m.

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
