Dear parents, friends and students,

#### **Reconciliation Week and Samoan Language Week**

This week marks Reconciliation Week and Samoan Language Week. The Reconciliation Week theme was 'Be Brave, Make Change' which focused on the successful 1967 referendum 1992 High Court Mabo decision. Both these decisions are significant in the reconciliation journey. The new Prime Minister is also on record as saying the Uluru Statement from the Heart will be adopted, giving a First Nations voice to parliament enshrined in the constitution. This will be a further step towards reconciliation for our nation.

Samoan Language week was also celebrated this week, with dance performances given by both primary and secondary students. This year's theme was 'Fa'aāuāu le Folauga i le Va'a o Tautai - Continue the Voyage with Competent Wayfinders of the Ocean'. It is one of the great strengths of our college that we have a multicultural student body and celebrate a wide range of cultures throughout the year.

#### **School visits**

In what has been a very busy week of collaboration with other schools, we hosted several schools as part of what we call learning walks. This involved a presentation by staff about our explicit improvement agenda and how we go about ensuring quality teaching is occurring at Woodcrest. Our visitors toured parts of the school, stopping into a classroom to look at how English is taught and the use of Bump It Up Walls to aid student improvement. It was a positive opportunity to share the great work that happens all over the campus at the college and it was well received by all.

#### **Watching Others Work**

As part of the capacity building of all of our staff, we engage in a process called Watching Others Work (WOW). WOWs are an effective way to learn from highly skilled experienced colleagues across the entire campus and our staff engage in this with a great deal of energy. As mentioned before, our overall focus this year is on Quality Teaching and by engaging in this work we all get better at our jobs, leading to better outcomes for students.

#### Sustainability

Our primary sustainability team presented the projects that have been underway in the primary to the college extended executive team yesterday. The team has been very busy with a range of projects including:

Recycling food scraps for the worm garden beds

Collecting 10c refundable containers

Planting native bush tucker trees

Planning for the new self-watering garden bed project

An enormous amount of planning has gone into the upcoming self-watering garden bed project being funded by a \$35 000 sustainability grant. The project will install new garden beds using a wick system that feeds water to the plants from a water reservoir in the bottom of the bed. Water will be captured from buildings in new rain water tanks to be used in these garden beds. The old existing garden beds will be moved and furbished adding to the new site. Classes will have access to these garden beds to use in curriculum studies of sustainability, science and HASS.

The possibilities are endless and students will gain many new skills and experiences. Given that sustainability is a such growing industry, students may even develop a desire to plan for a possible future career in this field.

#### **Gala Sports**

Students were finally able to compete at various inter-school sports today in netball, rugby league and soccer. The gala sports days were due to start last week, but once again the wet weather impacted on a school event. Nevertheless, our students have been training hard and today represented our college with pride displaying great sportsmanship and skills. It was lovely to see parents once again involved in school events supporting our teams. If all goes well, our students will have two more weeks of competition ahead.

#### **Primary Sports Days - Athletics Carnival Postponed**

We have made the decision to postpone the Sports Days scheduled for Week 9 this term to next term. They will now be held Week 2, Term 3:

Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> July - Years P-2

Wednesday 20th July - Years 3 and 4

Thursday 21st July - Years 5 and 6.

Nominated 12 year old students who wish to be considered for the school athletics team will still attend the secondary sports day on 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> June (Week 10 Thursday and Friday). They will not be needed for the entire time only for their selected events. 10 and 11 year old students wishing to be selected on the school team will have the opportunity to qualify during P.E classes and at lunchtime events if necessary. #### Starlab Incursion



Year 5 had the opportunity to attend the Starlab Incursion on Monday. Year 5 have been studying the solar system as part of their science unit and Starlab allowed them to see a presentation similar to what you might see at the planetarium at Mt Cootha. The inflatable dome set up in the hall certainly was able to simulate the night sky complete with stars and constellations. Additionally, animations explored a different look at the planets and our solar system in detail and illustrated the relationship between space exploration and advances in technology giving us many of the modern devices and equipment we use today.

It was of particular interest to me, as I once used the Starlab system to teach students astronomy as a science teacher the 1990s. The advances in the projection system far outweighed the basic projection system and pinhole cylinder I once used to simulate the night sky. The addition of air conditioning, air purifier and exhaust fan also made the modern day Starlab much more comfortable inside the dome filled with students.




