# Programs

## AFL School of Excellence

Students gain practical AFL experience, guided by qualified staff and accredited coaches, developing fundamental skills and opening up genuine pathways which can also translate to other sports.

## Basketball/Volleyball Excellence

The purpose of the Woodcrest Volleyball & Basketball Academy are to strengthen both individual and team skills within the sport. The academy is designed to make every individual a better athlete and in turn bring these improved skills to their college team. The program creates direct links with sporting clubs and associations that will help promote Volleyball and Basketball at Woodcrest.



## Little Masterminds

At Woodcrest State College our Little Masterminds is an entrepreneurial program where students have opportunities to apply their knowledge creatively and resourcefully, building on 21st century skills and citizenship. We are regularly involved in the local community markets and Bunnings with our stall, selling a wide range of items that the students have researched, designed and created.



## Catalyst Program

An extension program designed to engage academically gifted students in rigorous, inquiry-based and innovative learning experiences, encouraging higher-order thinking, and real-world problem solving with the aid of emerging technologies.



## STEM Program

Students apply science, technology, engineering and mathematics in contexts that connect school, community, work and global enterprise, enabling the development of critical thinking skills expected in the pursuit of STEM related careers.

## Robotics Club

Through hands-on activities, team work and project-based learning, students design, build and program small-scale robots.

## FISAF

At Woodcrest state college we have five FISAF Teams in the Primary School. We use sports aerobics combined with fitness and dance to perform skill elements and movement patterns with music, at a high intensity. Our teams have won State and National titles.

## Intra-school Sports

Various sporting carnivals are enjoyed throughout the year, including swimming, cross country and athletics carnivals.

## Interschool Sport Gala Days

Students have the opportunity to compete against neighbouring schools and progress through to metropolitan finals.

## Crest Crew Dance Team

An elite dance performance team representing the College in dance competitions and community performances.

## Drama Club

Extra-curricular drama workshops which help to enhance communication skills, build confidence, resilience and creative thinking.







## Vocational Education and Training (VET)

Delivered by local RTOs or TAFE, students can engage in practical, hands-on work and gain nationally accredited qualifications for a variety of industry career pathways.

We offer a supportive, multicultural environment, with short-term homestay programs for visiting students, an International Student Graduate Program (ISP) and international experience programs for our secondary students.

## Little Possums Playgroup

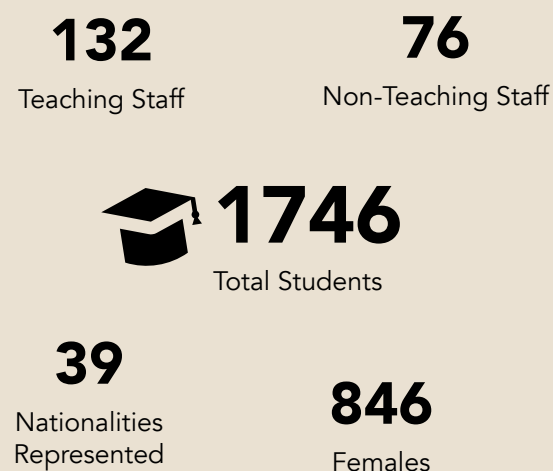
Welcoming small children and their parents to make new friends and enjoy fun activities and morning tea, building connections with our College and the local community.

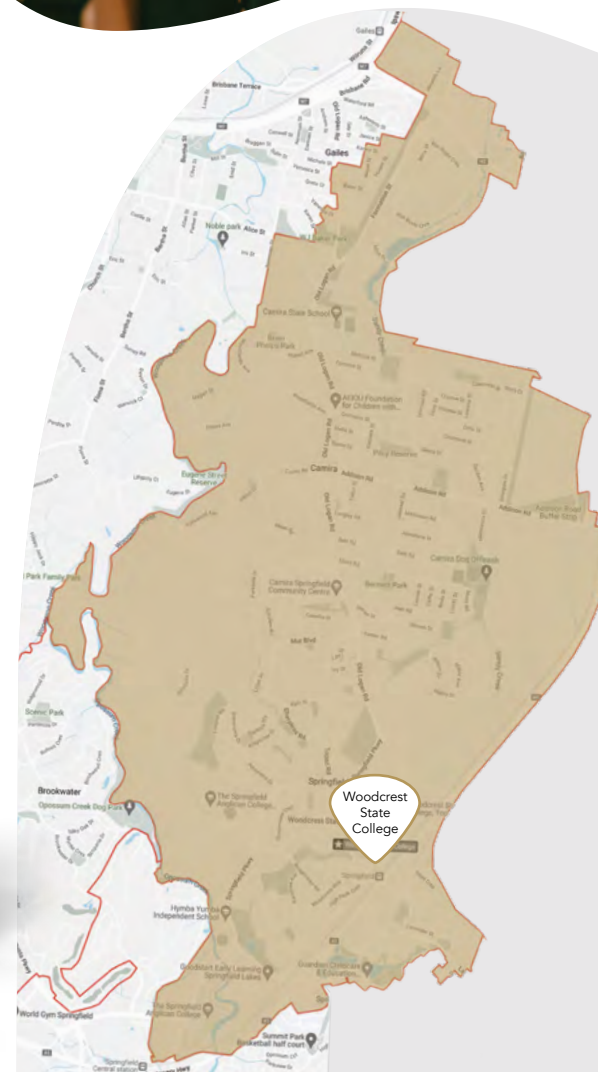
